REINSTATEMENT ORDER

11 This matter comes before the court on Matthew B. Borden’s Request for Reinstatement
12 of to the Guam Bar Association, dated June 28, 2022. On March 10, 2022, the Supreme Court
13 administratively suspended Borden for failure to timely register and pay the Guam Bar dues for
14 2022 despite having been duly notified by the Supreme Court of Guam of his delinquency and
15 given time to comply with the delinquency notice pursuant to Rules 8(c) and 8(f) of the Guam
16 Rules for Lawyer Disciplinary Enforcement and Disability Proceedings (“Rules”).

17 Because Borden has since made a written request for reinstatement, submitted a current
18 Guam bar registration, paid all arrears at the active annual rate plus all late fees and a penalty of
19 20 percent of the total amount due from the date of the last payment to the date of the request
20 for reinstatement (payable to the Guam Bar), and paid the \$300.00 penalty (payable to the
21 Supreme Court), he is now eligible for reinstatement. See Rules 8(d),(f). Therefore, the court
22 orders that the Suspension Order issued on March 10, 2022, is **VACATED** and Matthew B.
23 Borden is hereby **REINSTATED** to the practice of law in Guam. His name shall be placed
back on the roll of attorneys effective this date.
