This matter comes before the court on the Petition for Reinstatement to the Guam Bar, filed October 9, 2024, by Aleyshia F. Young. On March 8, 2023, the Supreme Court administratively suspended Ms. Young for failure to timely register and pay the Guam Bar dues for 2023 despite having been duly notified by the Supreme Court of Guam of her delinquency and given time to comply with the delinquency notice pursuant to Rules 8(c) and 8(f) of the Guam Rules for Lawyer Disciplinary Enforcement and Disability Proceedings ("Rules").

Because Ms. Young has since made a written request for reinstatement, submitted a current Guam bar registration, paid all arrears at the active annual rate plus all late fees and a penalty of 20 percent of the total amount due from the date of the last payment to the date of the request for reinstatement (payable to the Guam Bar Association), and paid the \$300.00 penalty (payable to the Supreme Court), she is now eligible for reinstatement. *See* Rules 8(d),(f). Therefore, the Suspension Order filed on March 8, 2023, is **VACATED**, and Aleyshia F. Young is hereby **REINSTATED** to the practice of law in Guam. Her name shall be placed back on the roll of attorneys effective this date.
